Buyers Instructions

For Displaying Art

Many non-artists are oblivious to the idea that art needs special care and cannot be handled the way a piece of furniture might be handled. Moreover, few artists now days take the time or trouble to instruct buyers of their art on how to properly take care of the art they just purchased. Many non -artists are oblivious to the idea that art needs special care and cannot be handled the way a piece of furniture might be handled.

You can help prevent the untimely demise of your art after it leaves the care of your studio by sending along a sheet of hanging and cleaning instructions with the sale. The sheet should offer general tips for handling and hanging original artwork out of direct sunlight, etc., and if you paint in pastels, specific handling of soft pastel paintings. It should also include a note of thanks for their purchase. A "how to care for" sheet helps to impress upon the buyer that they have purchased a valuable commodity, something that should be cared for and treasured. Hopefully, they will pass along your instructions to their children and help to increase art awareness.

TIPS FOR HOME DISPLAYING YOUR NEW ART IN YOUR HOME OR OFFICE

- When hanging works of art in your home, there are many things that you can do to minimize the damage caused by light.
- In the room where the hart will hang, fit windows with blinds or curtains that are kept closed when the room is not in use.
- Position your art so that it will not be exposed to direct light. For instance, the wall opposite a window will get direct light, while the wall beside a window will not.
- Do not use "picture lights" designed to attach to frames. In addition to over-lighting, "picture

lights" cause local heating that is damaging to works of art.

• Use incandescent light with no UV component, to light works of art. Select low wattage bulbs

and use a dimmer switch to set the lighting at the minimum level that allows you viewing comfort.

 If fluorescent lights are used, UV filtering should be incorporated either as sleeves or as lenses over the source of the light, or by using UV absorbing Plexiglas to glaze the works.


 Watercolour or gouache and created or printed on poor quality paper are particularly at risk and quickly damaged and should not be displayed on a permanent basis.

To Recap:

- Hang your new art in an interior room rather than a porch, sunroom or bathroom.
- Hang your new art on an inside wall.
- Don't hang your art over the fireplace or radiator or next to an air vent.
- Don't hang your art in the Basement, Bathroom or in the kitchen next to a stove or dishwasher.
- Don't hang your art in a place where direct sunlight will shine on it.



Kathleen Mattox/"Mixed Messages" ART

Kathleen Mattox is an artist from Sanger, California, in the heart of the central San Joaquin Valley. She painted while in college at Fresno State in the 1960's and has been part of many creative endeavors over the last 30+ years. Lucky enough to study with B.J. McCoon, Jean Ray Laury, Charles Chestnut, Robert Hurlitz, and Darwin Musselman at Fresno State, she took classes in watercolor, acrylic, oil, and fabric arts—and she finally returned to watercolor in the year 2000, after not painting for over 30 years. She considers her mentors/influences to be Monte Guynes, Kay Owens, Grace Rankin, John Salminen, and Karen Knutson.

A native of the San Joaquin valley who specializes in watercolor. She painted as a graduate student at Fresno state (with Darwin Musselman, B.J. Mccoon, Charles Chestnut, and Robert Herlitz) and returned to painting in 2000, although she explored many other creative avenues (quilting, stained class, calligraphy) in the 30 years she wasn't painting.



Most of her works begin with watercolor and then go on to incorporate other media such as permanent pen, gel pen, textured paper, magazine photos, modeling paste, watercolor crayon, opaque paint, metallic paint, gesso etc. In addition to loving a lot of color, she is especially drawn to the elements of line and texture and very aware of the power of contrasting values in effective paintings. Her works are large, usually full sheet watercolors.

Ready to experience retirement beginning in august 2006, she has been an elementary administrator and a district coordinator for Fresno unified school district. Her busy, challenging job kept her from painting as much as she would like, but painting was her stress-reliever and necessary creative outlet that allowed her to maintain energy and to "think outside the box" at work, too.

In the recent past, she has begun to further explore acrylics, oils, and soft pastels and to incorporate them into some of her current watermedia paintings. She continues to find herself most drawn to mixed media works and experimental collages.

Wanting her works to be fun for herself and her viewers, she is not afraid to experiment and "play" as she explores new subjects, ideas, and processes. Her subject matter tends to be impressionistic, expressionistic, and/or abstract rather than realistic. She likes to work in series, returning to the same subjects over time. Musical themes permeate many of her compositions, as well as clocks, Italian hill towns, the Madonna and child, abstract geometric shape compositions, and paintings that comment on the power of language.

Kathleen's works can currently be seen at her gallery, "Mixed Messages" ART, at 1310 8th Street in Sanger CA. Kathleen is a charter member and signature member of the Alliance of California Artists. She also has belonged to the California Watercolor Association and the San Diego Watercolor Society.

Historic Water Tower Gift Shop & Gallery

History: Fresno Water Works was established in 1976 by partners George McCullogh and Lyman Andrews to serve the needs of the town of Fresno. In 1890, a group of Chicago investors purchased the Fresno Water Company for \$140,000. In 1893, the water company hired architect George Washington Maher to design the new water tower for the City.

The base of the tower is brick and was constructed without steel reinforcing. The outer wall of the tower slopes inwards at the 10-foot level to join the inner wall. The inner wall curves to form the closed dome at 30 feet. The water tank lies above the dome and holds up to 250,000 gallons of water. It is listed on the national register of Historic Places.



For several years, the water tower was used as a parking meter and water meter repair facility. In 2001, the interior was remodeled and the tower was opened as a Visitors Center by the Fresno Convention and Visitors Bureau.

In October of 2014, the Fresno Arts Council took over operation of the Water Tower. The Water Tower functions as a Visitors Information Center for the City of Fresno, and it houses the Fresno Arts Council Gift Shop. The shop provides a unique shopping experience featuring fine arts, crafts and literature created by local artists, crafters and writers at affordable prices. The Tower also carries an array of Fresno specific souvenirs for out of town visitors.

The Fresno Arts Council (FAC) is a private, non-profit organization established in 1979 under the name of the "Alliance For The Arts" by local artists, arts organizations and interested individuals who wished to create a voice for the arts in the Central San Joaquin Valley.

FACs mission is to "enrich peoples' lives through the arts". Their purpose is to foster an arts community that recognizes and honors the contributions of its citizens to the arts. The Historic Water Tower Gift Shop & Gallery welcomes participation by local artists, crafters and writers.



BLOG: THE PRACTICAL ARTIST

WHAT IS NETWORK MARKETING?


There is a lot of talk these days out there about using social networks to market your art. You can certainly reach a lot of people with your message, but simply reaching them isn't good enough; you need to make them want to buy your stuff. One of the key ingredients in successful social media marketing is creating "social authority". When you establish yourself as an "expert" in your given field or area you become an authority (someone others listen to). You can establish yourself by writing on-line about stuff you know about. It doesn't necessarily have to be art because if you want to sell, you will need to reach outside the sphere of artists you know to your target audience. It's a funny thing, but having social authority in one sphere will give you authority elsewhere;



just witness all those celebrities who endorse presidential candidates!

As a result of social media – and the direct/indirect effect of social media marketers, the buying public is more likely to make decisions using what they read and see in social networks, but **only** if they hear about it from someone they trust. This is the reason a focused, carefully designed social media strategy needs to be a basic part of your marketing plan.

Social Networking sites are shaped to allow internet users to connect with each other. The primary



types of social networking sites service groups, i.e. former school classmates, a means to connect with friends (like Facebook and Twitter), etc...; most of these sites also feature a recommendation system linked to trust. Most social network sites are web based and provide means for users to connect over the internet via e-mail or instant messaging. Because most of these networking services do run on "friend recommendations" it can be difficult to create a network of buyers if you are not already acquainted with them. If you want your message about your art to be

picked up and sent "viral", you must create a message that is both interesting and attention grabbing. Viral Marketing, Viral Advertising, Or Marketing Buzz refers to promotion practices that use pre

-existing social networks. The goal is to create viral messages that attract people with high social networking potential (SNP) so that these people will tell everyone about the message. It's like a game of gossip.

As a general rule three basic conditions must be met for *your* communication to go viral. 1) A "go-between" or "dispatch rider" must pick up the message. There are three types of "dispatch riders" required to change an ordinary message into a viral one: market devotees, social hubs, and salespeople. Market devotees are among the first to get exposed to the message and transmit it to their immediate social network.



Social hubs are people with a large number of connections; they often know hundreds of people and can serve as tie-ins between groups with different interests. Salespeople receive the message from the market devotee, amplify it by making it more relevant and persuasive, and then send it on. 2) *The message must be memorable* and interesting. Only messages that are both will be passed on to others and spur viral marketing. Making your message more memorable and interesting (or



more infectious) can be a matter of minor adjustments. 3) the environment needs to be favorable: The timing and context of your promotion takeoff must be right too. If there is something much more interesting going on like the Japanese earthquake, your chances of getting a competing message out are not very good.

Question: how do you find these people? Well, you have to put in your time developing on-line relationships. It will be

necessary for you to express some type of interest in what they are doing so that they will reciprocate. I am not advocating spending hours on the net; in fact, just the opposite. However, you *will* need to be able to make a connection with them on some level. Keep your communications short and only respond to stuff that actually interests you because a phony interest can be easily spotted.

Want to know how effective you are? Here are a few free social media monitoring and measurement programs and tools:

How Sociable? A simple, free tool that measures the visibility of your brand across the web.

Addict-o-matic A nice search engine that aggregates rss feeds, allowing you to see where your brand is lacking presence.

Socialmention: a social media search engine offering searches across blogs, and microblogs with a social rank score.
