## PAINTING TRADITIONAL SUBJECTS

### EGGS AND RABBITS FOR EASTER

We live in the world so we can't help being influenced by it. Do you find yourself painting seasonally? By this, I mean are you inspired in the spring to paint flowers or using an amber themed pallet in the fall. Since it is getting close to Easter, I thought I would include some information about traditional 'Easter Art'. Most of the "Easter Art" I found when I researched for this blog was of two varieties. The old masters of course painted images of Jesus and the Resurrection. This is not surprising when you consider that a lot of art back then was commissioned by the Church. The card industry has been trying to establish the idea of sending cards for Easter for years. Vintage Cards usually had Angels, Easter Bunnies or kittens (when did they arrive in Easter traditions?), huge eggs and sometimes chickens. Like the kittens, I suspect they were included for their "cuteness" not because they are traditional subjects for Easter. Easter traditions are long and varied; on the one hand, we have the resurrection of Jesus Christ (Christian), Passover (Jewish), and the Spring Equinox (Pagan). Many families only attend services on Easter Sunday (Oh, excuse me

the new PC is "Resurrection Sunday"). The new PC form is an attempt by Christianity to distance itself from Easter's pagan roots. When it was first being established, Christianity found it expedient to co-opt some pagan celebrations and incorporate them into the new religion. Traditionally Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the full moon, very close to the Spring Equinox. In old Europe, the prevailing spring festival was a Saxon fertility celebration in honor of the Goddess Eastre, (earlier spelling was Eostre, derived from the Saxons' Germanic heritage) a Teutonic goddess of dawn, spring and fertility, whose sacred animal was a hare. The hare is often associated with moon goddesses; the egg and the haer (old spelling) together represent the god and the goddess, respectively. Pagan fertility festivals at the time of the spring equinox were common--it was believed that at this time, male and female energies were balanced. One of the main reasons the new Christian religion disapproved of the spring equinox celebration so much was the belief (not entirely unfounded) that it encouraged a freewheeling orgy.

Colored eggs, which we also associate with Easter, are of an even more ancient origin; eggs have been symbols of rebirth and fertility for so long no one can say when this tradition began. So where did modern traditions come up with the idea of a rabbit who brings eggs? There is a myth that says the goddess Eostre was passing through a forest one winter and found a bird dying in snow from hunger and cold. In pity, she turned the bird into a hare because hares have warm fur and can supposedly find food more easily than birds. Poor science here, but it sounds nice; The rabbit survived the winter and when spring came it laid eggs because it used to be a bird (obviously the change had been only skin deep). The appreciative Rabbit then decorated the eggs it laid as a sign of gratitude to Eostre. German settlers in Pennsylvania brought the tradition of seeking decorated Easter eggs with them to America and the Easter Egg Hunt was born.

Like Thanksgiving and Christmas, Easter has its traditional food; Ham, special breads, and of course Chocolate. Easter egg hunts were fun as a child, but I do remember that my mother refused to allow us to eat the eggs because they usually had been lying out unrefrigerated and she was afraid of food poisoning. It's no wonder really that merchants keyed in on these fears and decided that Easter was an untapped gold mine (gold foil that is). They began wrapping chocolate bunnies and eggs in colorful wrappings and the Cadbury Easter Bunny was born. The toymakers couldn't let this slide of course so they began marketing plastic eggs that could be stuffed with other candy and Easter baskets with toys. There is also the Easter Parade held in almost every town. Then of course, there is the fabled traditional Easter Bonnet. As a child, I always got a frilly hat and a new

dress for Easter which was dutifully worn to the family get-

together on Sunday afternoon.

Which brings me back to the subject of what to paint in the spring. All these items are infinitely usable as subjects for art; food such as eggs, ham, chocolate bunnies make good still life set-ups. If you are into figurative art, children hunting Easter Eggs make a great subject. Or if you really want to get into the theme there is always the resurrection or spring equinox as subjects.



## Jim Curnyn

## **Chris Sorenson Studios**



Over the past 25 years, the Chris Sorensen Studio, which he started in a warehouse filled with decades-old junk, expanded as the landlord slowly whittled that junk away. More than 40 artists now rent spaces — the cheapest at just \$135 a month — in a warren of rough-hewn studios that spill out from a main gallery area and large "Sorensen Hall."

**Chris M. Sorensen Studio** has been open to Fresno area artists since 1991. It is a working

studio, in the co-op style, in the downtown industrial area of Fresno, that hosts monthly shows--sometimes its own artists, other times groups that have rented the gallery for a show.

Chris works primarily in metal, welding, and has public installments in many locations in the Fresno region. Years ago, he opened up his studio to other artists, sharing space and equipment. The gallery was an outgrowth of that, and

continues to evolve. Shows change monthly, new shows open on Art Hop night, the first Thursday of every month.

The Sorensen Studio is a magnet for artists and art lovers alike. He invites art majors from local colleges to drop by and experiment with his extensive inventory of metal-shaping tools and equipment. His good- natured humor and supportive assistance



encourages them to challenge their creativity in the medium of metal. Local art patrons use the studio for art functions and fundraisers.

## **BLOG: THE PRACTICAL ARTIST**

#### CAN I DEDUCT MY EXPENSES AS AN ARTIST ON MY TAXES

If you are serious about your career as an artist you must realize that Art *is* a business, and like any business it is necessary to keep track of expenses as well as income. I have been searching for a comprehensive program for my art business for years. Currently I would recommend QuickBooks to track your expenses and income. While there are some all-inclusive programs beginning to be developed, I have usually found some flaw in the program; either they were hard to use, or had an incompatible photo program for thumbnails of my art, etc. There <u>are</u> a couple of new companies with programs designed for artists out on the internet, but as yet I have not tried any of

them so if you have information concerning them I am interested to hear from you.

Don't want to buy another program? You *can* simply use an excel spreadsheet to track income and expenses but it will be very time consuming. QuickBooks, while a little on the expensive side is pretty user friendly and easily transitions into tax software programs such as Turbo Tax when it comes time to file your income tax.

Yes, Virginia, at the moment I am actually using three programs to track my art: QuickBooks for income and expenses, two excel spreadsheets to tell me where my art is at any given time (Current Location Report) (Painting Information Sheets) to track awards, income from each painting or prints made from it, and a photo file with different sized images of my art for various uses (webpage, large-sized prints, and specific sizes for on-line show entries). For Photo Editing I use Photoshop Elements. It is less pricey than the full Adobe editing program and as a painter I really don't need the maximum amount of bells and whistles you get with the full Adobe Suite.

#### I can't say this often enough; back up your data!

- To conduct your career as an artist, at a minimum you should keep these types of records:
- A photo log with both high- and low- resolution photos of your work, kept separately from your desktop computer. A working copy can be kept on the desktop, but be sure and back up your files each month onto a separate disc or jump drive.
- A program that tracks income and expenses.
- A record of each piece of art created and its disposition or current location.
- Keep back-up copies of these items in a separate place. And up-date your back-ups monthly. Once your records are lost due to computer crashes, natural disaster or any other reason they are gone.

#### **DEDUCTING BUSINESS MILEAGE**

THE IRS DEFINES BUSINESS MILES as distances traveled using your vehicle while working on behalf of your employer or miles driven between jobs. For example, if your employer required you to drive from your office to visit clients using your car, that mileage would be deductible. The IRS does not allow you to claim a deduction for miles that you drive from your home to your job. This is considered "Commuting" by the IRS and is not deductible. For example, traveling to a client's home or business to paint or draw them probably would be considered Commuting.

**QUESTION**: If I work out of my home as an independent contractor, can I claim mileage to work sites and back home? Can I deduct trips made to the bank and post office? What if I make business -related trips from my home office and also stop to do personal errands? How do I figure the mileage?

ANSWER: Yes, your mileage to work sites and back are business miles that must be supported by written documentation of where you went and how many business miles you traveled. Trips to the bank and post office also qualify as business mileage if documented. Trips for personal errands are ignored. The end result of your records should be business miles for the year (with a backup written log) and total miles driven for the year. To document your total miles driven, take your odometer reading at the beginning and end of the year. The IRS often looks at the odometer reading on auto repair bills to see if your total miles are reasonable. You will need to check with the IRS for their current mileage rate.

QUESTION: I drove about 8,000 miles last year for my home business. I have some receipts, but I didn't log all the miles. Is an estimate OK? Can I still take the deduction if I don't have all the supporting information?

ANSWER: No, estimated business miles are not allowed to support your tax deduction. The tax court disallowed the auto expenses in 2009 for the owner of a real estate brokerage firm and her employee in <a href="Engle v. Commissioner">Engle v. Commissioner</a>. The taxpayer admitted that their reported mileage amounts were estimates. In a summary opinion they held that due to lack of substantiation the taxpayers were not entitled to the auto deduction. I personally know of someone who lost their house when they claimed "estimated "mileage on their taxes! It isn't worth it!
