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ENTERING JURIED SHOWS & EXHIBITS

In the art world, a "Juried Show" means a show that has an actual judge who has been paid to choose the best art out of the entries. Usually there will be a non-refundable entry fee per art piece, and cash and awards will be given to the winners. It also means your art may be checked for acceptability by a panel of artists before the judge sees it. This sometimes causes confusion because an Exhibition may also be "juried". This means that the exhibit organizer or a panel decides if the art is acceptable to be shown in the exhibit. Exhibits also don't give out awards, monetary or otherwise. Juried art shows are an opportunity to learn more about your craft. *Presentation is everything!* A poorly presented piece of artwork might as well take itself back to the studio. Would you buy a painting that was dirty, had dust on the



frame, smears or scratches on the glass, ripped paper on the back? Would you want it if you cut yourself on sharp picture wire sticking out the back when you lifted it? Would you show up the prom in greasy jeans? When making a first impression, your art should put its best foot forward. When you take your art to an art show, a gallery or present it to a prospective client, it should be ready to hang on the wall. The Frame should glow with polish, if the painting is under glass, the glass should shine and be free from dust, scratches and smears. Oils and Acrylics should have been cleaned of dirt and dust with a soft, damp cloth.

All paintings should be framed; gallery wrap (1.5" to 2" wide on the edge) is acceptable. Frames should be in good repair and ready to hang. use flat hangers with wires only, no Saw-tooth, eyelet hangers or quick frames and no screw eyes. The ends of the wire should be taped or sleeved. Screws for hanging should be no more than 4" inches from the top of the frame and the wire should not show over the top of the frame. All oils should be completely dry. Watercolor, Pastel, Drawing and some types of mixed media should be under glass or plexi-glass.

Hanging wire should have the ends either taped or be enclosed in plastic sleeves. (Inexpensive tubing can be bought at the hardware store, cut in small lengths, and then slipped over the wire before you twist the wire around itself.) Why are shows and galleries so picky? Hangers should be strong enough to support the art. Shows and galleries don't want to be responsible for damage to your frame if your art falls off the walls or show standards! Most shows require wires attached with a flat D-Hook and the ends of the wire taped or sleeved so they don't cut or stab anyone. If you are planning to enter the art in a show, don't use either saw-

tooth or screweye hangers. What's wrong with them? The sawtooth hangers are usually not sturdy enough to hold a painting (besides being hard to fasten with most hanging systems) and the screw eyes stick out and can poke holes in the wall or standard behind the art!

Entering a juried show means you are putting your art out there to be judged. You should always enter what you consider to be your best work to date. Keep in mind though, that your art may not be accepted into the show. Does this mean that you are a poor artist? Or that your art is "bad"? Not necessarily. A juried art show is a subjective format and there are many reasons why your art might not have been accepted. It may simply mean that the space to display art was limited. Perhaps the art was good, but your presentation (framing/ matting) detracted from your art and the judge preferred art that was better presented. Or maybe this just *wasn't* your best work.

If your art wasn't accepted by the judge, you might consider having an artist whose opinion you respect critique the work for you. Please be careful with this; the person who does the critiquing should be a more experienced artist with some knowledge of technique and the principles of art. We love them, but the opinions of our friends and family who don't know any more than we do about art really aren't useful as critiques. In many local shows, the judge will offer critiques as they judge, and a member of the art group putting on the show will have been assigned to follow and write down what is said. If the judge offers a critique, pay attention.

Above all, don't take this type of rejection personally. Nationally known artists get rejected from shows also. Sometimes the judge just doesn't like the subject matter or maybe he/she doesn't care for the colors, or the shape, etc. The point is: don't expect to enter a show your first or second time and win. You are probably going to kiss a lot of frogs before you get the prize! For some shows, just being accepted is major. Every juried art show should be viewed as an opportunity to learn more about your craft.

We've been speaking of a real-time art show. However, there is another type of juried show, the on-line show. In many on-line shows, you never need to travel to the show. You enter a photo of your art directly into the contest through the internet show site. Here also, presentation is very important. For the judges to get an accurate idea of your art, the image you send must match the colors in the art and be sharp and clear. For many of us, taking a good photograph of our art is hard. Before you send off the photo of your art you should 1) make sure that the size of the art agrees with the directions given by the prospectus, 2) make sure the image is sharp, clear and not distorted, 3) check the colors in the photo against the actual art to make sure they are correct.

While most on-line shows don't require you to send them the actual art, you should make sure of this. It would be terrible to be accepted into a prestigious show or even win an award and then find out the round trip price to get the art to the show is more than you could afford.

He often basks in the praise of readers and critics alike; and relishes such comments like, "Yeah, it was pretty good." and "You write books?" and "So how many books have you sold?" and "You do this for a living? I thought my job sucked. At least I get a paycheck."

A lifelong fan of SciFi and fantasy, his earliest memories were that of reading Danny and the Dinosaur and Curious George. From there he took the next logical step and delved deeply into the

WHERE THE HECK IS MY ART?

Over our lifetimes as an artist, all of us will probably create hundreds of pieces of art. When first starting out, it may seem anal and a waste of time to develop a recordkeeping system to track your work.

DON'T LOSE YOUR WORK!

When I created Art-Tique with fellow artist Lea Adams, one of the purposes of the organization was to find low-cost places where artists could show and sell their work. It was then I discovered the pitfalls of having a lot of art in many different venues! Many times artists would fail to pick up their art at the designated time because they didn't remember when it was due to be retrieved or which venue they had placed it in! For my own sanity, I created the **Art Location Sheet** and I began handing out free to everyone. It is a simple sheet arranged this way:

ITEM 1—Art Title

ITEM 2—(optional) Media

ITEM 3—(optinal0 Subject

ITEM 4—Date of receiving for show or exhibit

ITEM 5—Show name

ITEM 6—pick up date

ITEMS 7, 8, 9-past three shows or exhibits



Although it can also be kept on paper in a ledger, I prefer the computer worksheet format because it can be sorted many times by the location so it is very easy to see not only where a particular painting is, how many paintings I have at that location, and when they are due to be picked up. This report also provides a quick reference if I have previously entered it in a particular show. If you keep the Current Location Sheet

and the Art Information Sheet updated, you always have records of your work and where it has been.

The Art Information Sheet is a one-page record of each art piece created, and should have the following items:

ITEM 1—a pictorial image of your work. This can be in the form a printed photograph, a slide or a digital image. If your work is 3-deminsional, be sure to take photos of all sides of the work. Since this image is not going to be used to reproduce the work, a small, low-resolution image will suffice. The image should be large enough to see details of the work, clear and without blurring.

ITEM 2—the title of your work, size, style/genre and when it was finished. Knowing when you created a piece of art might become important if someone pirates your work and sells it because who created the art first often decides who has the copyright. If you have no record of when an art piece was created, you might even be found in violation of your own work!

ITEM 3—a brief description of the work. I suggest you use complete sentences because many on-line sites require this when uploading to their site. Optional-I also like to keep a kind of diary as to what I wanted to achieve, why I chose this image, and what was going on in my life when I created this art piece.

ITEM 4—Keywords to be used when downloading the photo of your art to your web site or other internet media so you can just copy and paste.

ITEM 5-A Show and exhibit record is a list of what shows or exhibits were entered, when they took place and if the art won awards.

ITEM 6—Wholesale and Retail price. This is probably the hardest thing for an artist to decide on-how much to charge for an artwork! What is the difference between Wholesale and Retail? Wholesale is always lower than Retail. aA a minimum your wholesale price

costs. should cover the amount of what it cost you to create the art, plus any gallery commission fees and hopefully with a small profit margin. Retail price for an art piece should cover all this plus what you as an artist feel the art is worth in time and effort. I realize this is very subjective but most of art is subjective.

ITEM 7—Incidental information such as the date you formally copyrighted the work, cost of the copyright, etc.

ITEM 8—If you had limited editions of a painting or photograph or copies of a sculpture made, when, how many, how much it cost to make them, how many sold and how much you made when you did.

ITEM 9-the date you sold the original art and the name and address of the Buyer.

You also should keep three types of Photo records A photo log with both high-, medium-and low- resolution photos of your work, kept separately from your desktop computer. A working copy can be kept on the desktop, but be sure and back up your files each month onto a separate disc or jump drive.
