FEATURED ARTIST MISAKO RUNGE






Misako is a stay-at-home mom with three children. She is kept busy with her childrens' activities (baseball, softball, basketball), but while they are in school, she has time to study art. She started with drawing and watercolor and moved into ceramics, where she found her true love. She says it relaxes her and brings joy to her life.

Misako's ceramics, mural of "bird", came from her childhood memories. She has always been fascinated with nature's mystery, power beauty and patience. Each time she observes nature, she notices and learns something new. This inspiration is expressed through her work by combining personal experiences to create her own unique through the forms of objects used in clay.

Inspiration from nature, like tree shapes, flowers, animals and architecture bring beauty into her clay art. The tremendous variety and freedom of ceramics connects the viewer with the earliest traditions of pottery, even simple objects such as cups or plates. Fantasy, humor, symbolism, and sculptural invention enrich the pottery forms which remain fundamental to human activities.

"Finally, I know what I want to do with my life—Art, especially ceramics. Ceramics has a wide range of effects I can create. A piece of clay can look like bronze, stone, rusted metal or anything you can imagine. My inspiration comes from natures. My goal is to learn how bring beauty into art."
