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



Soft Focus

Author Jayne Ann Krenz

Review by Mystery Loves History aka sci-fi/fantasy writer Gail Daley



I enjoyed this story. In her contemporary Romances, Krenz specializes in a certain kind of heroine; the tough business exec paired up with an equally tough hero. She's very good at creating realistic conflicts between the two. In so many contemporary romances the conflicts and the resolutions come off as artificial. Not the case with Krenz. Her stuff rings as authentic. And in this case, she paired it with a tightly woven mystery. Plenty of twists and turns to this one.

Putting her emotions aside, she insists on helping him search for the scientist who's disappeared with a valuable new crystal that could revolutionize the high-tech industry. She'll go in, solve the problem--and get out.

The trail leads Elizabeth and Jack to a fringe film festival, but their goal is as elusive as the shadowy black-and-white images from classic noir films. Life starts to imitate art, and double-dealing seems to be the name of the game. For these business adversaries turned reluctant partners, keeping an eye on each other--and the lid on a sizzling attraction--seems the only insurance against further treachery. But with millions at stake, trust can turn to betrayal in the blink of an eye.

JOHN STEINBECK'S 6 WRITING TIPS

- 1. Abandon the idea that you are ever going to finish. Lose track of the 400 pages and write just on page for each day, it helps. Then when it gets finished, you are always surprised.
- 2. Write freely and as rapidly as possible and throw the whole thing on paper. Never correct or rewrite until the whole thing is down. Rewrite in process us usually found to be an excuse for not going on. It also interferes with flow and rhythm which can only come from a kind of unconscious association with the material.
- 3. Forget your generalized audience. In the first place, the nameless, faceless audience will scare you to death and in the second place, unlike the theater, it doesn't exist. In writing, your audience is one single reader. I have found that sometimes it helps to pick out one person—a real person you know, or an imagined person and write to that one.
- 4. If a scene or a section gets the better of you and you still think you want it—bypass it and go on. When you have finished the whole you can come back to it and then you may find that the reason it gave trouble is because it didn't belong there.
- Beware of a scene that becomes too dear to you, dearer than the rest. It will usually be found that it is out of drawing.
- If you are using dialogue—say it aloud as you write it. Only then will it have the sound of speech.

ABBY RUBINSTEIN

In 1943, at the age of fifteen, Abby Rubinstein began her studies at



art school the of Brooklyn Museum of Art in York. Having scholarship after her first continued her she studies with Rufino Tomayo, Presser, Joseph Pippin, Francis Chris and water colorist John Bindrum.

Rubinstein refers to herself as an "American

Expressionist", and finds that if she needs a "label", it is with the philosophy of the early Expressionists that she holds the greatest affinity.

Dipping into the vast array of ideas, people, and vitality of her world, Abby seeks a configuration or movement, color or atmosphere that corresponds with her innermost emotions. She uses this as her vehicle, bending it and developing it until it speaks for her and meets others with whom it can have a conversation.

Rubinstein is interested in using nature, not copying it. The turn of a head, the wrinkle in a sleeve, the flip of a finger, the transition of a color to another can be unbelievably expressive of attitudes and emotions. She attempts to grasp these as she perceives them and brings them together into a moving and powerful work of art.

Rubinstein believes that a true work of art transcends time barriers and that an imitative picture with nothing more exciting than correct proportions and acceptable composition will, in very short order, mean very little to anyone. But she thinks that a true work of art contains an indefinable element that touches a main spring of intuitive response within a viewer and affects a very intimate meeting. It's that intimate meeting that she seeks when she paints.

Rubinstein believes that if she expresses herself adequately, the viewer is invited into the painting. This is her purpose and if she is successful then it is her achievement.

HERE THERE BE DRAGONS

Why are humans so fascinated by Dragons? On the surface, they are just over-sized lizards; or are they? Writers have been writing about dragons from time immemorial (from the fable of St. George and the Dragon to the modern-day stories of Anne McCaffery's Dragon rider series).



I first became interested in Dragons when my then 10-year old son Andrew did. We kind of slid into dragonlore by way of dinosaurs. As a family, we watched every movie ever made about dragons, from Disney's Pete's Dragon to a wonderful documentary called "Dragons, A Fantasy Made Real" narrated by Patrick Stewart and created by the Discovery Channel. It treated the subject as if they were an extinct species. Since this had been my son Andrew's original premise, it was great. He has a very active

imagination, but then he grew up to write juvenile fiction.

Since I am an artist as well as a writer, Andrew wanted me to do a door mural on his room featuring dragons. My first attempt, which I did on canvas, was called <u>MIGHT FLYERS</u>; for this painting, I basically used a herd of running horses as my model of a flock of flying dragons. Unfortunately, according to my self-appointed dragon expert (Andrew) they looked too much like horses because their legs were too long and skinny.



Determined to get it right this time, I re-rented all the dragon movies I could find, and spent hours with the TV on pause while I drew dragons. That was when I realized that Hollywood didn't have any more clue as to how they should look than I did; I found five or six different looks for them. Finally, after some trial and error, I did manage to



achieve a composite that met with Andrew's approval. I painted it on his door. I call it *PLAYING DRAGONS*.

Since I figured that when he eventually moved out he wouldn't want to

haul a door with him, I also painted another version on canvas, which I called *A FLIGHT OF DRAGONS*. This one he could take with him.

I am not the only person fascinated by dragons, I have found a great website called http://www.draconika.com/ that ______



identifies and describes many kinds of dragons. This only one of many sites available on the internet; all that is needed is to type in dragons as a search.

Much later, I was watching clouds while I waited in



camp for my husband to return from gold panning in the desert and I saw a dragon in the sky. I changed the scene to night because I felt it would provide a more dramatic scene and called it <u>DRAGON'S BREATH</u>. I am still painting dragons; he latest dragon image is a miniature of a dragon's eye called <u>DRAGONEYE</u>.
